Спебли папируса разрезали на продольные полосы, которые плотно укладывали друг на друга крест-накрест и высущивали. Потом листы склеивались нежду собой и своречивались в свитки (в не сцивались в книпа, как сегодне). Если бы не папирус, не на чен было бы писать не только египтенан, но даже греком и римленан. А ещё Нил соревнуется с Аназонной за звание саной длинной реки на Зенле.








THE NOMADS: TRADITIONS AND **TECHNOLOGY**






I AM A PRINCESS!


